# "LOVE FOR FOOD AND FOOD FOR TASTE"

No dought food is physiological need for us but our present day generation consume food out of desire and passion. From rice, roti, ice cream, chocolate to burggers and pizzas everything is found in our daily food menu. Thus lot of differences were observed among younger and elder generation. In this regard an attempt was made by journalism students to know

the food habits of GKVK students by conducting survey involving 300 students. Which consisting of state , out of state, and international students. This would certainly determine the factors influencing the wide variation in preference, taste and choice.

#### **Daily routine**

Among food preference there are equal percentage of students like to have rice &parota's (67%) followed by idli & dosa (30%) as breakfast. For dinner / lunch 35% of them prefer rice, 34% roti & 30% ragiball. It's interesting to note 2% of students from other states have learnt eating ragi ball after coming to Karnataka. Regarding consumption of beverages 43% of them prefer tea, followed by 32% coffee & only 14% for fresh juice. As weekend special 66% of them prefer non-veg out of which 17% of them have changed the food habits from vegetarian to non-vegetarian due to peer pressure.

Either East or west homemade food is the best is the voice of 95% of students 66% of them are sure of having a balanced diet. Students of Karnataka consume ice cream once in a week where as of other states/countries twice a week. 23% preferred bakery food and felt that they are healthy. Intrestlingly 73% preferred traditional food followed by 27% preferred modern food. By this we can say that the food habits of the students was mainly influenced by the taste followed by their health consciousness and family background.

Home made healthy food or outside junk, hostel's-chitrana or canteen's gobi, hot puff or tight packed lays. What ever it is, food makes him say YUMMY....!!!

We have entered the age of garbageous mountains and dusty atmosphere, where our campus still preserves it with enormous biodiversity in it. Our campus of 1380 acres is one of the biodiversity heritage site which was declared on

8/9/2009 under Karnataka biodiversity board. It has flora of (530 plants), mamals (14 sps), birds (170 sps) and eve migratorybirds butterflies (100 sps), insect collection of about 150000 specimens, 2425 ant sps and reptiles (10 sps) of which four are poisonous snakes with zero fatality rate. And interestingly a lepord stayed in our campus for 2 months in 2003.

The BG(Botanical Garden) of GKVK has 28 hectareswhich was

declared as lead park by the National Bio-resource Development Board,India.It harbours 81 plant families,128 medicinal plants and has tree arboratum collection of 3708 germplasms.This is the rich greenery heritage of our campus.Lets not wait till the last tree is cut,last river is poisoned,last fish is dead to realize that money cant be eaten.
